

# COVID-19 Testing and Travel Outside Canada

COVID-19 Collection Centres are only funded to offer testing for:

- anyone with symptoms of the flu or COVID-19
- anyone Public Health directs to be tested

Testing for travel, work, or school is not done at any of these centres.

## Where can I be tested?

The Government of Canada advises people not travel outside of Canada if it is not essential.

If you must travel outside of Canada, you need to pay for a COVID-19 test at one of the private pay clinics offering testing.

Contact the clinic directly for costs and to arrange testing.

## Returning from travel

If you travel outside of Canada, you are required by law to self-isolate for 14 days and complete a self-isolation plan.

Provincial government officials must review your plan for self-isolating before you can return home.
