

Did your child get their routine vaccines?

Vaccines are safe. It is safer to get the vaccine than to get the disease. As your child gets older, the protection from vaccines they received as babies can wear off. Children can be at risk of new diseases. Protect your child and others by getting all vaccines on time.

How to check if your child's immunization record is up-to-date

For routine vaccines: use the online Vaccination Status Indicator Tool at immunizebc.ca/vaccination-status-indicator

For COVID-19 vaccines: use the online provincial database (Health Gateway) at fraserhealth.ca/health-topics-a-to-z/coronavirus/covid-19-vaccine/immunization-record

If your child's online immunization record shows they are not up-to-date <u>but</u> another health care provider (outside of Public Health) gave the vaccines, contact that provider. Ask for a copy of your child's immunization record. Report your child's vaccines online at <u>fraserhealth.ca/immunizationform</u>.

If your child received COVID-19 vaccine(s) outside of B.C., submit their immunization record to the Ministry of Health at immunizationrecord.gov.bc.ca.

Where to get vaccines

If your child has not yet received all routine vaccines, contact your local public health unit, family practitioner, or pharmacist. All routine vaccines are free in B.C.

To find out where to get vaccines, visit <u>fraserhealth.ca/getimmunized</u>. Not all family practitioners and pharmacists offer vaccines, so call ahead to ask.
