Fees for non-residents and uninsured residents

As outlined in British Columbia's Ministry of Health policy, Fraser Health is required to collect fees for medical treatment provided to both non-residents of Canada and uninsured residents.

Below are the fees for non-residents of Canada and uninsured residents, per person, per visit.

| Service | Fees |

| Visit for non-residents of Canada - foreign nationals | \$200.00 |
| Visit for uninsured resident of Canada | \$75.00 |

Fees for Urgent and Primary Care Services

Payment information for uninsured services and non-residents and uninsured residents accessing our services.





When is payment for Urgent and Primary Care services required?

Non-residents of Canada

You will be charged the non-resident rate:

- If you are not a Canadian resident
- If your permanent residence is outside of Canada

Uninsured residents of Canada

You will be charged the uninsured resident rate:

- If you do not have any current Canadian, provincial or territorial health coverage (such as a valid health card from a Canadian province or territory).
- If you are a new resident and do not have medical coverage from another province and are not yet eligible for Medical Services Plan (MSP).

Uninsured Services

There is a charge for services that are not covered by MSP, such as a medical note for work.



Frequently asked questions

- **Q:** I have third party private health insurance. Can you bill my insurance company for me?
- A: Unfortunately, Urgent and Primary Care Centres are not able to process charges to third party private insurance providers. You will be provided with a receipt and invoice. You can submit receipt and invoice directly to your insurance provider for reimbursement.
- Q: Can I pay with cash or cheque?
- **A:** At this time, Urgent and Primary Care Centres can only accept payment via credit card or debit card.
