Sadie is a low-income senior and uses the food bank often. She has trouble taking all her medicines.



Ming is a single mother. She lives with depression. She thinks she is pregnant.



Ingrid drinks alcohol every day. She smokes a pack of cigarettes each day. She is bothered with asthma.



George is addicted to pain killers. He has not worked for a year. He is not eating well.

All of these people live in Langley.

None of these people has a regular doctor.

Our **nurse practitioner** helps people like Karl, Sadie, Ming, Ingrid, and George get health care services they need until they get their own doctor or nurse practitioner.

How can I get health care services?

Like these people, you can get health care services from our nurse practitioner if you:

- ✓ live in Langley and
- ✓ do not already have your own doctor or nurse practitioner

We are here to help you if you:

- live on the street
- live with a limited income
- live with a mental illness
- use alcohol or drugs or both

We will see you for any current health needs until you have your own doctor or nurse practitioner.

What kinds of help can I get?

Here is what we do:

- Medical check-ups
- Help manage your medicines
- Arrange for blood work and x-rays
- Help you live with your health condition
- Give flu shots and other immunizations
- Connect you to support services in your community

For women, we offer birth control medicine and pap tests.

If you need to see a specialist, we arrange it.

Note: We do not generally prescribe narcotic pain medicines.
