How to securely hold your child for a safe immunization

2 months (1st visit)

- 1. Cradle child in one arm with child held against your body and resting on your lap
- 2. One of your child's arms embraces your back and is held under your arm
- 3. Wrap your arm around the child and hold child's arm towards your body
- 4. Hold child's leg firmly at the knee



4-6 months (2nd and 3rd visit)

- 1. Sit child up on your lap propped up against your arm
- 2. One of your child's arms embraces your back and is held under your arm
- 3. Wrap your arm around your child and hold their arm firmly towards your body
- 4. Hold child's leg firmly at the knee



On or after 1st birthday (4th visit) Arm injection:

- 1. Sit child up on your lap. Place your child's legs between your legs
- 2. One of your child's arms embraces your back and is held under your arm
- 3. Hold your child's outer arm at the elbow pressed firmly towards you





18 months or older Pretzel hold:

- 1. Sit forward in chair so child cannot push against chair
- 2. Sit child on your lap with child's arm tucked behind you
- 3. Wrap your arms around child's back and chest, under child's arm and use your hand to secure child's forearm/wrist
- 4. Place child's feet between your legs and apply sufficient pressure to hold.

School entry (4-6 years of age)

- 1. Place child on your lap with child's legs between your legs
- 2. One of your child's arms embraces your back and is held under your arm
- 3. Wrap your arm around child and hold their shoulder
- 4. With the other arm, hold child's arm at the elbow
