Interpreter Services

If you do not speak or understand English well enough to have conversations about your health or to make medical decisions, we can book a medical interpreter. This is a free service. Let us know you need an interpreter at least one week before your appointment.

Anyone with a transplanted kidney must have their medications and health checked regularly for the rest of their life.

One week before your first visit

✓ We have given you a requisition for a fasting blood test. Please do this blood test one week before your first appointment.

For your first visit

✓ Bring all the medicines that you take with you to your first visit.

For each clinic visit

- ✓ Bring an up-to-date medication list and any important health information such as blood pressure records and blood sugar records.
- ✓ Arrive at least 5 minutes early.
- ✓ Check in at the Reception desk.
- ✓ Let us know if any of your contact information has changed since your last visit.
- ✓ Weigh yourself on our scales.
- ✓ Book your next clinic visit before you leave.

Who you meet at the clinic

Our unit clerk:

- Organizes any tests you need.
- Arranges any appointments with other doctors.

Our registered nurse:

- Compares your weight today with your previous weight.
- Checks your overall health and any problems you are having related to your transplant kidney.
- Reviews your medications.

Our kidney specialist (nephrologist):

- Talks with you about any changes needed to your treatment.
- Reviews the results of your blood tests.
- Orders blood tests or other tests.

You might also meet:

- A dietitian (appointments available on request to help you with your diet)
- A social worker (can help with any social supports and counselling)

For your kidney health

We are here to help you stay in the best of health and keep your kidney working as well as it should.

In order for us to tell how well your kidney is working, you must get blood tests every month. We will give you a requisition for the blood tests. Please do blood tests at your local laboratory.

With every visit, we check to make sure your transplanted kidney is working properly and treat any problems that we find. How often you come to the clinic is different for each person.

Visits are booked for Monday to Friday between 8:30 a.m. and 11:30 a.m.
