What is the Overdose Outreach Team?

We work with adults who:

- are more likely to suffer a toxic drug poisoning
- want help accessing services that lower the chances of a toxic drug poisoning

We know that most people who use substances do not have a substance use disorder.

We do not require people to alter or change their substance use to access our services and support.

Who is on this team?

We are a team of peer support workers, outreach workers, nurses, and social workers. We have people on our team with lived and living experience of substance use.

What does this team do?

Support

We offer support these ways:

- Help you make your own plan for preventing overdoses and promoting wellness.
- Advocate for your needs within our healthcare system.

Connect

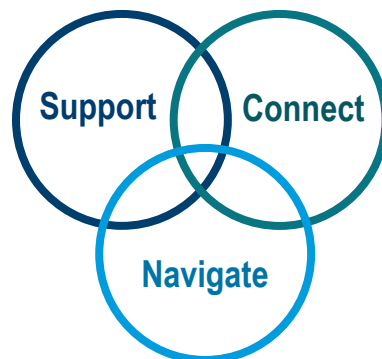
We can connect you to services and supports such as:
