Our services

There are several reasons why a child might be referred to our unit.

Examples of our services:

- A child needs to stay in the hospital for a short time so we can observe their health and medical condition.
- A doctor in the community needs a child to see a pediatrician urgently.
- A child needs fluids or medicine by intravenous.
- A child needs to come in during the day for a medical procedure (such as placing a feeding tube), or to change bandages on wounds.

Our care team

- pediatricians
- nurses
- other health professionals as needed, such as a physiotherapist, social worker, respiratory therapist


We have a family-centred, child-friendly approach to care. We value the well-being as well as the emotional, physical, social, cultural, and spiritual safety of the children we care for and their families.

Slips, trips, and falls

Most slips, trips, and falls can be prevented. Please help your child move around the room or unit when they feel dizzy, light-headed, unsteady, or when they have just had a procedure.

Please make sure your child wears non-slip footwear when walking about the room or unit.



Remind your child to always walk, not run, in the hospital.

Safety and security

A hospital identification (ID) band must be kept on your child during their stay. We check the band to make sure we are giving the care ordered by the doctor for your child.

Every member of the healthcare team wears Fraser Health photo identification. If you are not sure who a staff member is, please ask. Do not allow your child to go with someone who does not have proper identification.
