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# Community Residential Program

## Licensed Facilities

### *WHO WE ARE*

The **Community Residential Program (CRP)** is part of the community mental health system. The team provides a continuum of residential options/semi-independent living arrangements, and support services. The CRP team works in cooperation with facility staff, residents, family members and service providers

### *WHO WE SERVE*

The program serves adults nineteen (19) years of age and over who are diagnosed with a serious and persistent mental illness. Referrals are accepted from other teams within Surrey Mental Health and Substance Use Services, hospitals, physicians, community and other mental health centers.

### *OUR PURPOSE*

Our purpose is to encourage community reintegration and optimal independence for persons with a mental illness by providing stable and supportive living environments. This gives each person the opportunity to develop and/or maintain social, vocational, life skills and education to work towards the highest level of independence possible.

## *PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS*

- **New Greenwood Lodge**

This 11 bed home is for men who are living with a brain injury and would benefit from a secure environment structured around building self-esteem and meeting individual needs. Individuals participate in organized outings and are encouraged to become as independent as possible.

- **Hillside Lodge**

This 10 bed home is for men and women about 40 years and older, who would benefit from long-term placement with the structure of regularly scheduled programs.

- **Kimbelee Place**

This 10 bed home provides a rehab program focused on helping men and women maximize their independence and/or return to independent living. Residents have the opportunity to work on independent living skills and cooking and are provided with prompting and support.

- **Argyll Lodge**

This co-ed 25 bed home provides therapeutic programs and activities focused on maintaining and promoting mental, physical, emotional, and social health for adults.

- **Chrysalis 22**

This 11 bed home has single bedrooms and allows the men who live there to work at their own pace and develop confidence in their daily living skills, before moving on to a more rehab-focused program.

- **Chrysalis 24**

This 10 bed home is adjacent to Chrysalis 22 and also has single bedrooms. This program supports people in building skills toward their goals of independent living and community integration.

### *SUPPORTIVE PROGRAMS:*

- **Assertive Community Treatment (ACT)**

This outreach mental health team provides intensive case management and offers treatment, rehabilitation and support services for individuals to live successfully in the community. This team addresses and responds to the needs of individuals who otherwise would not access mental health services

- **Injection Room**

- **Aboriginal Liaison worker**

- Provides community support
