

## Supportive Programs:

- **Assertive Community Treatment (ACT)**

This mobile mental health team provides intensive case management and offers treatment, rehabilitation and support services for individuals to live successfully in the community. This team addresses and responds to the needs of individuals who would otherwise not access mental health services.

- Medication Case Management

## OVERVIEW

- 205 case managed beds and/or housing units; 5 which are shared units.
- Housing, Skills for Life and Psychosocial Rehabilitation programs support growth towards independent living
- Varied support is provided for each individual
- All individuals who access CRP Supported Housing must sign a *Participation Agreement Form*
- Programs are funded by private contractors and various agencies.

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# Community Residential Program

## Supported Housing

### WHO WE ARE

The **Community Residential Program (CRP)** is part of the community mental health system. The team provides a continuum of residential options/semi-independent living arrangements, and support services. The CRP team works in cooperation with facility staff, residents, family members and Service providers.

### WHO WE SERVE

The program serves adults nineteen (19) years of age and over who are diagnosed with a serious and persistent mental illness. Referrals are accepted from other teams within Surrey Mental Health and Substance Use, hospitals, physicians, community and other mental health centers.

### OUR PURPOSE

Our purpose is to encourage community reintegration and optimal independence for persons with a mental illness by providing stable and supportive living environments. This gives each person the opportunity to develop and/or maintain social, vocational, life skills and education to work towards the highest level of independence possible

## PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS

### Supported Housing Programs:

*All Supported Housing Programs include support to meet basic needs & rent subsidy.*

- **Congregate 1 & 2**

2 residential homes with 4 individuals in each. Varying levels of support are provided to each individual.

- **Bolivar Court**

An assisted housing program for individuals who have had difficulty finding, or maintaining housing. (Low barrier housing)

- **S.I.L. and S.S.I.L.**

SIL, a "Supported Independent Living" program, and Super SIL provides rent subsidy for individuals' chosen housing. Individuals receive varied additional support to live independently in the community.

- **Bear Creek House**

Assisted Living program that provides daytime support needs in order to maintain successful, semi-independent living in the community.

- **Len Shepherd**

A residential psychosocial support program in partnership with BC Housing; provides self-contained apartments and Health Care Worker support.

- **Sutton Place**

Consists of 2-bedroom townhouses; individuals share their living arrangement and an enhanced subsidy is provided. Includes phone, cable, hydro and support worker.

- **Timber Grove (Enhanced support)**

30 beds; semi independent housing program.

- **Garden Lodge**

For adult males with cognitive impairment disorders and low I.Q. (many have brain injuries.) 24 hour care, with a nurse available approx 2 hrs/day. Clients are expected to need minimal prompts for ADL's.

- **Rudy's Place**

For adult females with cognitive impairment disorders; (clients may have specialty needs such as deafness or brain injury.) There is not 24 hour care, but it is in a family care setting and meals are provided. Clients are expected to be independent with ADL's, rehab ready, and may come and go as they please.

### Skills for Life Programs:

*Consists of 2 structured programs that focus on rehabilitation & recovery. Both programs are for individuals coming from licensed residential care*

- **Training Apartment Program (TAP)**

Includes repeated 1 week supported placements in a fully furnished apartment to practice and/or develop skills in the areas of nutrition, housekeeping, basic money management, community mobility, personal care, medication and time management. Participation can last from 12-18 months.

- **Felix House**

A 4-bedroom home. This program consists of the developmental skills provided in TAP, as well as 3-4 educational group activities per week. Individuals remain in the program from 9-15 months
