What is the Breast Health Clinic?

This is a clinic for women and men who have a lump or a change in their breast. Our clinic has a team of health professionals who have special training in the care and treatment of the breast.

The aim of our clinic is to see you as quickly as possible and find the reason for the change in your breast.

Please note:

A change in your breast does not mean there is something 'wrong' or that you have breast cancer.

What can I expect?

Most clinic visits are 1 to 2 hours long.

The clinic doctor sees you and does a breast exam.

You could have a mammogram, an ultrasound, or both. We try to do them during your visit, but we might ask you to return another day.

If the clinic doctor thinks it is needed, you might have a breast biopsy (sounds like *bye-op-see*).

A biopsy is when we take a sample of breast tissue and send to our laboratory to be examined. If it cannot be done the same day, we arrange an appointment for you to return for this test.

When will I know the results from the tests?

When you have a change in your breast, you want to know what it is right away. Our goal is to give you answers quickly.

Usually, we can give you results of tests the same day. If you have a biopsy, we give you an appointment 7 to 10 days after the biopsy to see the surgeon about the results.

How does my family doctor know about my clinic visit?

We send your family doctor a report summarizing your visit and the results of your test(s).

We are here to answer your questions and support you through this process.

It's good to ask questions

Having a change in your breast and waiting for results can be very stressful.

If you have questions any time during your clinic visit, please ask us! We are here to support you.

If you think of questions while you are waiting use the space below to write them down. Then ask us when next you see the clinic nurse or doctor.
